     continue to have historically low levels of retirement.
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     We continue to perform our record maintenance on all of
     the outstanding cases with the goal of releasing the
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     self-service calculator to the entire population, not
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just those that are within range of retirement. We've kind of shifted our focus in earnest in that direction. We have a team of some of our newer employees who have started off with some of the enrollment process that are getting involved into the record maintenance process going forward.

One of the next priorities of the division continues to be the Municipal Employees Retirement System implementing the reforms that were passed this past legislative session and evaluating a set of potential new reforms for what we are calling MERS 2.0 with the goal of providing an opportunity to non-MERS-participating entities and incentives for those entities to consider joining MERS. To that end, this week, we've hired a new individual in the Retirement Services Division. The name is Megan Kowanski (phonetic). She's an actuary and she's been employed in the past by USA - USI and Milliman, and we're very happy to have her.

But other than that, I don't have anything new to report this week.

Christina worked at UCONN while her working career ended due to injury in March of 2012, however she had been inactive and in and out of work from 2007 to 2010. While working, Christina was in the ARP program. On November 18th, 2018, Christina both mailed and faxed the CO-944a to the RSD. The eFax confirmation submittal sheet confirms that two pages were sent to the Retirement Services on November 18th, 2018.

This commission previously denied Christina's request for a transfer, however it did not have the benefit of the eFax confirmation document that was sent before this meeting. On November 18th, 2018, Christina also emailed the RSD confirmation about her intent to submit the CO-944a opt-in form. This email was accompanied by an automatic response of receipt from the Retirement Services Division. Following the submission, Christina was under the impression that she had successfully opted into the SERS program and wasn't aware of any problems.

retirement options, she realized that her paperwork has not been processed. And that brings us here today, and that's basically the overall summary. If there's any questions for me or for Christina, please feel free to ask.

I'm seeing something in the writeup about a disability

retirement and I'm interested to hear about how that

plays or theoretically would play into a decision here.

MR. ZIMBERLIN: Well, if she was placed into SERS retirement, she'd have all the options available for her, including filing for the disability retirement. Her career was ended in 2007, I believe, which is the date of her injury. And she was out on the (inaudible) long-term disability for a while, so we would probably be pursuing disability retirement.

That's not before this commission today. We're just trying to opt-in as of today.
