#### Dear Governor Malloy:

I write to provide you with financial statements for the General Fund and the Transportation Fund through April 30, 2013.

OPM is currently projecting a Fiscal Year 2013 General Fund GAAP surplus of \$164.8 million and a budgetary surplus of \$212.3 million. This is an improvement in the General Fund's fiscal position of \$14.7 million from last month. The Transportation Fund is estimated to end Fiscal Year 2013 with a balance of \$169 million. I am in general agreement with these projections.

The surplus results from an improved revenue outlook and spending restraints. Current projections show Fiscal Year 2013 General Fund outlays increasing by about 2 percent over last fiscal year. Deficit mitigation efforts, constraints on payroll growth, and fringe benefit budget reductions have contributed to the slower overall rate of spending growth. General Fund revenues for Fiscal Year 2013 are estimated to increase at a 3.6 percent rate over last year. Two factors are driving the gains in receipts. First, double-digit growth in the estimated and final payment components of the income tax associated with strong equity market performance and tax changes. And second, the unanticipated revenue windfall that has occurred in the inheritance and estate tax during this fiscal year.

General Fund revenues are anticipated to close the fiscal year \$76.9 million over the original budget estimate. Net spending within the General Fund is projected to fall \$135.4 million below the Fiscal Year 2013 initial appropriation level.

The slow rate of the economic recovery continues to present budget challenges. In April, the state added 6,300 non-farm payroll positions. The past twelve months have produced six months of job gains and six months of job losses. The state's unemployment rate remained at 8 percent in April. To date, the state has regained 47.4 percent of the 121,200 jobs lost during the recession.

Connecticut's personal income grew 2 percent in 2012 ranking the state 49<sup>th</sup> in the nation. Private sector weekly pay in the state was down 3.5 percent from April of last year. Advance retail sales in April were up 3.7 percent over the same period last year, which is well below the growth experienced throughout most of 2012. New business starts in Connecticut have seen double-digit declines in each of the first three months of 2013 compared to the same periods in 2012. On a positive note, the housing market is rebounding. In April Connecticut housing permits were up almost 50 percent over last year. Home sales and price data are also showing solid improvement.

I also issue a Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) that converts the budgetary based financial reporting to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). From a balance sheet perspective, the GAAP shortfall or unreserved fund balance in the General Fund was \$1.146 billion as of June 30, 2012. This represents an improvement in the unassigned fund balance deficit of just over \$600 million from last year.
