MR. HERRINGTON: Good morning, everyone. And before I get started with the Division Director's Report, the General Counsel, Yam Menon, has an item she'd like to discuss.

MS. MENON: Good morning, folks. Yem here.

I just wanted to give an early reminder heading into the annual reporting of the Statement of Financial

Interests from the Office of State Ethics. This year's report is due May 1st, so you will have some time to file. So I just wanted to get that on your radar.

As a reminder, it's an electronic-only filing, so paper filings are no longer accepted. If you have done one before for the Retirement Commission, the system should have your information, so it should be pretty straightforward to just do your updates, click through the system, and submit. So I just wanted

to remind you about that.

Any questions on the SFI itself, feel free to let me know. Also, the emails that will be coming to you from the Office of State Ethics will have contact information in case you have technical questions, like you can't get past the screen, or you have any issues with the filing itself.

So just wanted to give an early heads-up.

And then, for anybody who is also either a State

employee or a member of another entity that you have to

file for, you only have to file once, but you just

cross-identify it for your respective agencies.

So just wanted to give that heads-up. I'll give one last reminder in April. So just wanted to let you know. Thanks, everyone.

MR. LUCIANO: Thank you.

MR. HERRINGTON: Yes. So good morning, everyone. I've circulated the Director's Report.

Again, we see a slight uptick in retirement activity, but these are still kind of historic lows for, you know, probably the past 18 months or so.

In terms of what the focus of the Division has been over the past month, there's probably two primary focuses. The first would be the implementation

of the MERS reforms. So we have the MERS documents, the provisions for the DROP plan to discuss today.

Also, this office continues to work with a working group on additional potential MERS reforms, and there likely will be a submission of legislation to create a new board to oversee the MERS plan. That's something that I believe we are sending to the legislature, if not today, later this week.

We're also going to fix the one issue relating to MERS reemployment where there's the prohibition on MERS retirees from working for non-participating municipalities and also participating in that non-participating municipalities' pension plan.

Beyond that, the next focus of the Division has been on enrollment issues. We have some new technology and sequels where we're able to identify historical contribution errors across any of the number of plans that we administer. We've instituted a default program, so hopefully this will correct and prevent errors from occurring in the first place. But there is a lot of cleanup for us identifying individuals that were enrolled in the wrong plan, and that's a focus we hope to go live with, that new functionality for the default plans, by April 1st.

But those are the major projects that the

MR. KELSO: Okay. Good morning. Thank you for hearing me this morning. Here's the situation. I am an employee of the Fairfield Public School System, which is a municipality, as we all know. I am not - at the time that I filled this information out, I was - I am not a State worker. I'm an employee of a municipality, Fairfield Public Schools.

So when I was hired at WestConn, as part of the onboarding process getting (inaudible) all of this information to fill out via email, and there's no one that gives you any help or talks you through it or explains anything. You just get a lot of stuff in your email and you're to go and fill it out.

So I did; I did that. And in the process of filling it out, there is boxes to check. And one of the boxes says, if you're a member of the Teachers' Retirement System. So I went and looked up to figure out where I was as an employee of the municipality, and everything that I can read, including the email of the Teachers' Retirement Board, is TRB, TRB, TRB, Teachers' Retirement Board.

On WestConn's paperwork, it has it as the Teachers' Retirement System, okay? So there's -

there's a conflict there, Teachers' Retirement System,
Teachers' Retirement Board. I looked around, checked
up, you know, looked at their email address at
Teachers' Retirement Board. Then I went to the rubric
that is enclosed that Mr. Sedrowski sent to all of you,
hopefully. Thank you for all of his work because he's
been back and forth with me, and I appreciate it.

If you look at the top column in the rubric all the way to the right, it again mentions, if you are a State employee, right? I am not a State employee.

I'm an employee of Fairfield Public Schools,

municipality. So I checked off that I didn't want to be part of the retirement system.

And then I went around and I was talking to people, and they said to me, I think you made the wrong election. And I said, on the basis of what? And they said, well, you are a part of the Teachers' Retirement System, even though it's TRB.

So I asked to, you know, have that changed, and they said, no, that it's irrevocable. Now, we are at a loss for teachers in the State of Connecticut and nationally, okay? I'm not sure why we want to penalize teachers for working every day for our students, public schools, higher education with an irrevocable - I'm not asking to go back and submit funds that I'd lost. I'm

asking from now forward.

So it's not like I want things to be retroactive. I just want to be able to be part of the retirement plan and have some monies deducted from my part-time salary at Western Connecticut State University.

So that's what I'm asking you, to allow that to be changed this one time. I don't know anywhere where anything is irrevocable. If you have to take the Bar and you don't do well, you can take it again. If you want to be a certified teacher in the State of Connecticut, you don't pass the test, you can take it again. So I'm not sure why this is irrevocable.

And if it is going to be irrevocable and difficult for people to make a change, then the paperwork needs to be adjusted in a manner so that it's not confusing to people, either that or someone needs to sit directly next to a person and help them navigate this paperwork.

So that is my case. I'd be happy to answer any questions.

CIESLAK: Can you clarify what 22 asynchronous means? 23 MR. KELSO: Asynchronous means that there's no face-to-face, that I've created a learning 24

management system that's connected with WestConn's,

which is they're using Blackboard, and I use Google

Classroom. As I'm teaching pre-service teachers in the

public school system, they'll be using Google Classroom

more likely than they will be Blackboard. So that's

the system I use.

So when I'm teaching an asynchronous class, I post weekly. Actually, I post through the whole semester, and then it's set up where it comes out weekly. So once again, there is no conflict of interest between my duty in the public school system and my duties at the State university system.
