ATTORNEY CIESLAK: Yes. Good morning, This is Cindy Cieslak. Present today we everyone. have Chairman Peter Adomeit, Tax Counsel from Robinson and Cole, Bruce Barth; Trustee Karen Buffkin; Trustee Michael Carey; Trustee Carl Chisem; General Counsel from Rose Kallor, Cindy Cieslak; Deputy Comptroller and ex officio member of the Retirement Commission, Tara Downs; Division Director from the Retirement Services Division, John Herrington; Trustee Brian Hill; Trustee David Krayeske; General Counsel and Assistant Comptroller, Yam Menon; Trustee Karen Nolen; Trustee Michael O'Brien; Actuarial Trustee Claude Poulin; Actuarial Trustee Tim Ryor; and from the Retirement Services Division, Ben Sedrowski. MR. CAREY: Mr. Chairman, this is Michael Carey. I can make the motions if you like.

CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Thank you.

MS. BUFFKIN: And this is Karen - this is Karen Buffkin. I can second.

CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Perfect. Okay.

ATTORNEY CIESLAK: Mr. Chairman, this is Cindy Cieslak. For the record, I will note that General Counsel from Rose Kallor, Michael Rose, just joined us. And on my agenda, I don't know if John Herrington has anything for the Division Director's Report if you want to call on him first.

CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Okay. John Herrington.

MR. HERRINGTON: Yes. Good morning, everyone.

I don't have a lot to add other than, you know,
what's presented in the standard report with respect
to the numbers. We continue to tick up a bit toward
the average level of retirement activity in SERS.

One thing that we've worked on, that has been an issue both for SERS and MERS, is identifying individuals who have passed away and to whom we've continued to pay retirement benefits. That's something that we will hope to present to the Commission in terms of what that activity has been and how that might relate to a consideration for us

to follow the lead of the Social Security

Administration and require direct deposit as opposed to paper checks.

The majority of our retirement population, you know, approximately 45 to 50,000 individuals, receive their checks through direct deposit, but there still are about 5,000 that receive paper checks. One thing is, many times we first become aware of a death is when there have been uncashed checks for a considerable amount of time; that's probably our greatest indicator of a death.

With respect to the direct deposit, we don't necessarily have that indicator; the money just continues to be deposited to the account. We've had some instances where there's actually been, you know, some indication of fraudulent activity where third parties that are not entitled to the money have withdrawn the funds, but I think far more frequently it's just a question of the money continuing to be deposited. Even in those cases, it's far easier on the Fund if there are checks that are uncashed than when there's been money that's been deposited to an account and there's a question of whether the account has been closed and to what extent we have the ability to claw that money back.

So what we hope to do is to research this further, have some meaningful numbers to present to you, and perhaps present a way to deal with both issues by, you know, adopting a policy where the default would be direct deposit, but also, at the same time, for us to perform periodic proof-of-life audits to ensure that we're identifying the people who have passed away.
