Is there anyone that I missed? Thank you.

CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Okay, thank you. Division Director's report: John Herrington.

MR. HERRINGTON: Yes, I sent along the numbers. Again, we have a slight uptick from where we've been the past couple of years, but we're below the historical averages.

One issue that stood out this month is that, with the changes to the SERS provisions, there are COLAs that are paid monthly. Historically they were paid on either January 1st or July 1st.

The amount of the COLA that we pay in any given month is based on the increase in the CPI for the previous 12 months, which, with the current government shutdown, we do not have that CPI figure for the October checks, so what we've done is, we've estimated what the cost-of-living adjustment should be, being 2% under, you know, the majority of reasonable scenarios; that's the COLA that the formula would produce. And so there is the potential that we may need to make adjustments to COLAs when we actually do get numbers from the Bureau of Labor and Statistics.

My understanding is that at first it appeared that that was part of the entire shutdown, so the shutdown would need to be resolved before we would get those figures. This impacts Social Security as well.

My understanding is that now it's likely, if not a certainty, that we would get the updated figures by October 24th. So, by next Friday we should be able to make any adjustments that are needed. But hopefully, by estimating the COLA amount at 2%, we will be at the standard 2%.

ATTORNEY ZIMBERLAN: That's for me. I do have a little bit longer of a presentation.

CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Okay.

ATTORNEY ZIMBERLAN: Patrick Butler. He was a Tier IIA employee. He got a -- as to his Tier IIA contributions, 5-193(u) is the controlling law in his claim. Section 193(u) not only disallows an agency from refunding the contributions after a member vests, it also allows a member to receive his or her hazardous duty contributions which are in excess of regular SERS contributions.

Section 193(u)(d); at the time of severance,
Butler was vested for normal retirement under 193(1)
based on his ability to purchase one month of unpaid
FMLA and also 193(m) for early retirement and also
193(e) disability retirement based on his ability to
purchase one month of unpaid FMLA for the nonservice-connected disability, and he was also
eligible for the service-connected disability.

As to the CO-628C form which Butler filled out to get the refund of contributions, it has additional limitations in it that are not included in 193(u). The CO-628C form also did not include

agency signatures when it was processed.

Lastly, Butler's severance letter failed to inform Butler of his disability retirement options by his agency at the time of severance despite clear evidence to the judicial agency that he was having a mental health crisis.

As to Butler's mental health condition, at the time, he was suffering from visual hallucinations and had a mental break. And so we're just basically requesting an invoice so he can go in front of the Medical Examining Board.

CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Okay. Butler is on the Executive Session for discussion, so we will, when we get to that point, discuss it in Executive Session. Thank you very much.
